

## Andrew Haig

Andrew J. Haig, M.D. is Active Emeritus Professor of Physical Medicine at the University of Michigan and president of Haig et al., Consulting, a group that works with health systems, payers, and governments to build rehabilitation and pain programs. Author of over 150 scientific papers and a textbook, his research focuses on neurophysiology of spinal disorders, rehabilitation team leadership and rehabilitation in global health policy. He also leads The International Rehabilitation Forum, an organization dedicated to building medical rehabilitation in low resource regions. Dr.Haig's work has been recognized with the top research, teaching, and patient care awards in American Physiatry and in 2016 he was honoured with both the ISSLS Award for top global spine research, and the AANEM Distinguished Researcher award in neurophysiology.

Dr. Haig graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, the Medical College of Wisconsin, and Northwestern University's Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago. He is board certified in the specialties of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Pain Medicine, and Electrodiagnostic Medicine. Haig currently resides in Vermont, USA, where he remains clinically active in a small independent practice.
